## A Message from Father Ken

Beloved,

I do speak (and write) a good deal about the economy these days. I actually went to college with intent of becoming an economist . . . and then I took calculus! I had taken it in high school and earned an A+, but college was an entirely different matter. The professor was Dr. Marx and he was a very nice man, but I still remember the middle of the second class when I no longer had any idea what he was saying. I went to every make up class, all to no avail. Finally, he applauded me for my efforts and promised to assist me on the condition that I never take another math class. He kept his end of the bargain and I did too.

Recently, I read something from Stanley Hauerwas, professor of theological ethics at Duke Divinity School, that caused me pause. I would love to hear what you think. He addresses how difficult it is for preachers to talk about the economic situation in our country because congregations and local situations are so different. Money words can be "fighting words" too. "I often say that one reason the church seems to concentrate so much on sex and lust as a sin is because we think we know what it looks like when we get it wrong," Hauerwas explains. "We seldom talk about greed, because how would you know if you are greedy?"

He goes on from there. Those telegenic political commentators we are assaulted by nightly seem to be fixated on returning the economy to normality without ever questioning whether the growing gap between the very rich and the very poor is something worth preserving. "Since greed is so hard to recognize (even though it is a much greater concern in the New Testament than lust), many people didn't even know that they were suffering its effects until the recession hit."

I saw a great many more brave, stoic faces among you during the winter of 2009 than I see these days. As you share with me anxieties about bills and mortgages and retaining employees, I see the weariness in many of your eyes. It even shows up in what's called "compassion fatigue" - are people confident enough about their own
